

Lesson Title: It's Time to Grub Up!

Duration: 2 -45 minute class periods

Overview: Problem solving activity focusing on the job of a fishing vessel's galley cook. Students demonstrate math skills to create a grub list within a predetermined budget while also comparing prices from local grocery stores in order to make the most economical choices.

Content Area: Math

Standards: Math 4.NBT: 3. Solve multi-step word problems posed with whole numbers and having whole-number answers using the four operations, including problems in which remainders must be interpreted. Represent these problems using equations with a letter standing for the unknown quantity. Assess the reasonableness of answers using mental computation and estimation strategies including rounding 4. Fluently add and subtract multi-digit whole numbers using the standard algorithm. 5. Multiply a whole number of up to four digits by a one-digit whole number, and multiply two two-digit numbers, using strategies based on place value and the properties of operations.

Objectives: Students will learn how a galley cook must plan ahead for a trip, primarily the ordering of food and other provisions preparing for approximately two weeks at sea within a predetermined budget. In addition students will also practice comparing prices, and making the best economic choices.

Materials: Blank Grub List

Local Grocery Store Fliers (print or online)

Calculator

Activator: Ask students about their household food budgets and choices.

(Grocery store prices, weekly sales, household food budgets, etc)

Discussion questions included with the activity sheet. Brainstorm a grub list with the class on the board.

Assessment: Check student work (grub list) for correct computations.

Suggested Answers: See teacher notes provided

Extension: <u>Draw conclusions</u>: How the students' balances within the predetermined budget? Whose balances were over or under budget? Who was the closest? Who saved the most money?

Student Task:

Imagine that you are the galley cook on the fishing vessel. You will have a crew of seven for fourteen days, eating three meals a day plus snacks. You must create a grub list using local grocery store fliers (look in newspapers or online) to help with prices. Remember, you want to get the most for your money but your crew can't go hungry. You have a budget of \$1,800.00 for this fishing trip, try not to go over that amount!

- How many meals do you think a fishing boat crew will eat during two weeks out to sea?
 3 meals for 7 men =21 meals a day, 21meals a day for a week=147 meals, multiply by two for two weeks worth of meals (294 meals)
- What do you think a typical grub bill would cost? Answers will vary

Activity

Imagine that you are the galley cook on the fishing vessel. You will have a crew of seven for fourteen days, eating three meals a day plus snacks. Figure out the number of meals per day, per person, per week then two weeks with the students. You must create a grub list using your local grocery store fliers (look in newspapers) to help with prices. Students have a budget of \$1,800.00.
